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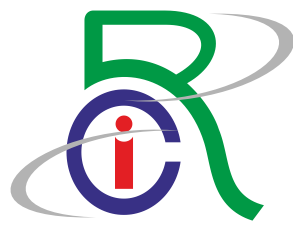
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CHAPTER 1**INTRODUCTION****VISION**

To create an environment that facilitates the highest standards in human resource development in the disability sector based on principles of human rights and inclusion.

MISSION

To ensure enhancement in the quality of existing and emerging human resource development programmes in disability rehabilitation and to address the life cycle needs of persons with disabilities across the country, including those from remote and less-served areas.

The Rehabilitation Council was set up under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 vide Resolution No. 22-17/83-HW.III dated 31st January, 1986 to have uniformity and to ensure minimum standards and quality of education & training in the field of special education and rehabilitation. It was given statutory status by an Act of Parliament, the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (No. 34 of 1992) dated 1st September, 1992 effective from 22nd June, 1993. The RCI Act was amended by Parliament in 2000 (No. 38 of 2000) to make it more broad based. The Act provides for constitution of the Rehabilitation Council of India for regulating and monitoring the training of rehabilitation professionals and personnel, promotion of research in rehabilitation and special education and maintenance of a Central Rehabilitation Register (CRR).

By signing and ratifying the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD), India has committed itself to harmonise all the domestic laws including the RCI Act. The Convention has brought the inclusion of persons with disabilities to the centre-stage need to implement the provisions of the Convention in its true spirit. Accordingly, the syllabi and curricula of the various rehabilitation courses developed and standardized by RCI are being continuously revised so as to meet the requirements of the relevant provisions in the UNCRPD.

MAJOR PROVISIONS OF THE RCI ACT**Objectives of the Council**

1. To regulate and monitor the training programmes in the field of rehabilitation of persons with disabilities.
2. To prescribe minimum standards of education and training for various categories of professionals dealing with persons with disabilities.

3. To regulate these standards in all training institutions to bring about uniformity throughout the country.
4. To make recommendations to the Ministry regarding recognition of qualifications granted by Universities, etc., in India for rehabilitation professionals.
5. To make recommendations to the Ministry regarding recognition of qualification by institutions outside India.
6. To maintain Central Rehabilitation Register of persons possessing the recognized rehabilitation qualification.
7. To encourage Continuing Rehabilitation Education in collaboration with organizations working in the field of disability.
8. To promote research in rehabilitation and special education.

Functions of the Council

1. The qualifications granted by any University or other institution in India that are included in the Schedule shall be recognized qualifications for Rehabilitation Professionals.
2. Any University or other Institution which grants qualification for rehabilitation professionals not included in Schedule may apply to the Central Government to have any such qualification recognized and the Central Government, after consulting the Council may, by notification amend the Schedule so as to include such qualification therein and any such notification may also direct that any entry shall be made in the last column of the Schedule against such qualification only when granted after a specified date.
3. The Council may enter into negotiations with a recognized authority in any other country for setting up of a scheme of reciprocity for the recognition of qualifications. In pursuance of any such scheme, the Central Government may by notification, amend the Schedule so as to include therein any qualification which the Council has decided should be recognized, and by such notification may also direct that an entry shall be made in the last column of the Schedule declaring that it shall be a recognized qualification only when granted after a specified date.
4. Registration of Rehabilitation Professionals in the Central Rehabilitation Register of persons possessing the recognized rehabilitation qualifications as per the Schedule attached to the Act.
5. To prescribe the minimum standards of education required for granting recognized rehabilitation qualification by Universities/Institutions in India.
6. To prescribe the standards of professionals, conduct and etiquette & code of ethics for rehabilitation professionals.

7. To assess and grant approval to institutions/universities for the training of professionals in the field of rehabilitation and to facilitate their recognition and its withdrawal by the Government.
8. The Council may appoint such number of visitors as it may deem requisite to inspect any University or Institution wherein education for rehabilitation professionals is given or attend any examination for the purpose of granting recognized rehabilitation qualifications.

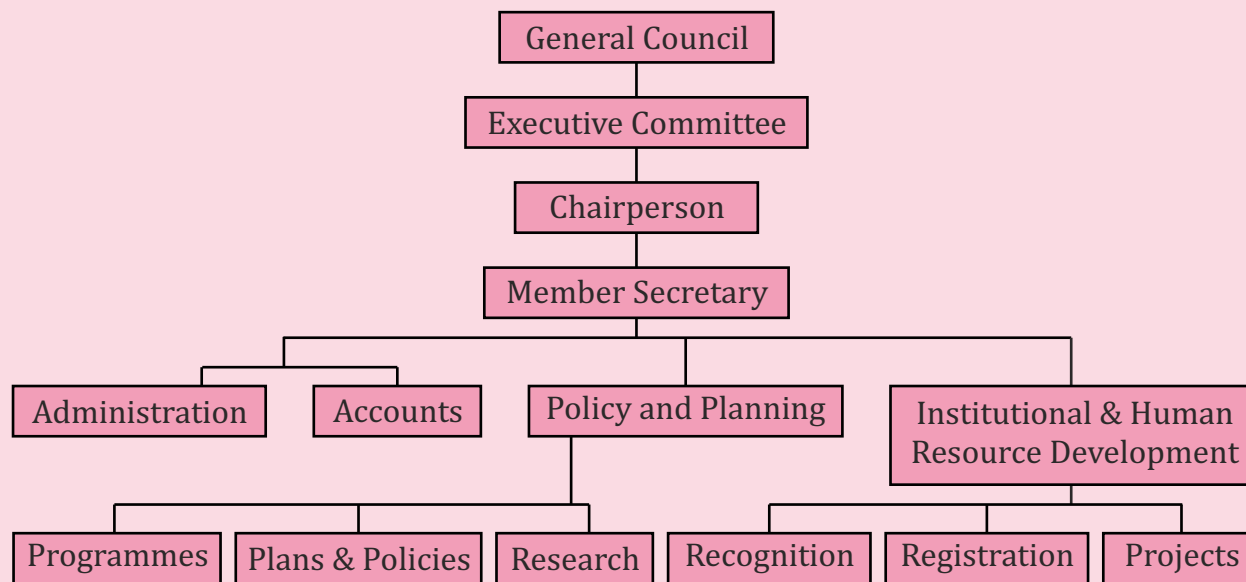
Rehabilitation Professionals under the Purview of the Council

COUNCIL AND ITS MEETINGS

The Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) functions under the administrative control of the Department of Disability Affairs, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment. RCI is headed by the Chairperson, who is also the Chairperson of the General Council and Executive Committee. An organizational chart of the organization is given below:

In accordance with Sub-Section (1) and (3) of Section 3 of RCI Act, 1992 (34 of 1992), the Central Government appoints Members of the General Council of Rehabilitation Council of India consisting of a Chairperson and 28 Members representing the Ministries/ Departments, rehabilitation professionals, social workers, medical practitioners and Members of Parliament. The Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India, vide Notification No. S.O. 550 (E) dated 13th April, 2005 appointed Major General (Retd.) Ian Cardozo as the Chairperson of the General Council. The Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment re-constituted the Council vide Notification No. S.O. 2479 (E) dated 15th October, 2008. Prof. (Mrs.) Sudesh Mukhopadhyay has been appointed as Chairperson vide Notification No. S.O. 887(E) dt. 25th March, 2014.

MEETINGS OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL

As per RCI Act and Regulations, the Council shall have general control on the affairs of the Council and authority to exercise all powers and perform all the acts and deeds of the Council.

As per Section 4 (3) of the RCI Act, 1992, the Council shall meet at least once a year at such time and place as may be decided by the Council or Chairperson may decide. As per Section 7 (2) of the Rehabilitation Council of India Regulations, 1997, General meetings of the Council may be held at any time during the year and at such time and place as the Chairperson may decide. Accordingly following two meetings of the General Council were held during the year.

35th Meeting of the General Council

35th Meeting of the General Council was held on 28.11.2013 at India International Centre, New Delhi with Maj. Gen. (Retd.) Ian Cardozo as the Chairperson. The gist of the discussions and the decisions taken in the meeting is as under:



35th Meeting of the General Council

1. Minutes of the 63rd, 64th and 65th Executive Committee meetings were perused by the members.
2. 26th Annual Report for the year 2012-13 including the Audit Report and Annual Accounts for the year 2012-13 was approved by the Council.
3. Proposal to maintain pay parity of certain categories of RCI employees with CSS/CSSS as per recommendations of the Sixth Pay Commission was approved for submission to the Department of Disability Affairs, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment for consideration and approval.
4. The proposal for framing of a scheme for reimbursement of medical expenses for treatment and hospitalization in respect of the retired employees of RCI and their

dependent family members living in the areas covered by CGHS as in case of the Central Government pensioners, was approved.

5. The proposal for delegation of financial powers and declaration of Dy. Director (Admn.), RCI as Head of Office was approved.
6. Draft Rehabilitation Council of India (Conduct of Examinations, Qualifications of Examiners and the Condition of Admission to such Examinations) Regulations, 2013 for operationalisation of National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation (NBER) were approved for submission to the Department of Disability Affairs, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment for approval and notification.
7. With regard to promotion of research by RCI, it was suggested that RCI should commend good research work done by Institutes and individuals/students in the area of disability rehabilitation and to introduce a scheme of giving financial support as well as annual awards. Scheme may be placed before the Executive Committee for approval.
8. It was also decided that RCI should invite research proposals and seek financial support for funding research from major corporates under Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR).
9. On the issue of higher registration/affiliation fee charged by some Universities, it was clarified that RCI has no role in fixing such fee by the Universities and it may not be possible to get the fee reduced by the Universities as they are autonomous. RCI, however, could write to them explaining the constraints of the disability sector.

10. It was decided that norms for the States of Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Jammu & Kashmir may be reviewed as was done in the case of North-Eastern States for conducting RCI approved courses keeping in view the geographical location, non-availability of training institutions and faculty on the one hand and need for human resource on the other. The policy could be periodically reviewed.

36th Meeting of the General Council

36th Meeting (Special) of the General Council was held on 21st March, 2014 with Prof. (Mrs.) Sudesh Mukhopadhyay as the Chairperson at Civil Services Officers' Institute, New Delhi. Following are the details of the decisions taken in the meeting:

1. Shri T.D. Dhariyal, Member Secretary, RCI welcomed the newly appointed Chairperson, Prof. (Mrs.) Sudesh Mukhopadhyay and four newly nominated members, namely, Shri Sunkara Sreenivas, Dr. Manisha Aggarwal, Dr. Dhulipala Samba Siva Rao and Dr. Saroj Thapa to the General Council. A resolution was unanimously passed by the General Council to place on record its sincere thanks, gratitude and appreciation to the outgoing Chairperson, Maj. Gen. (Retd.) Ian Cardozo, AVSM, SM, and four members, namely, Smt. Beroz N. Vacha, Dr. Yogesh Kumar Trikha, Dr. Kripa Ram Arya and Shri Suresh Sharma, for their work and contribution to the progress and achievements of RCI during their respective tenure as Chairperson/Members of the GC/EC.

2. Following observations were made with regard to the Progress Report of the Council:
 - (i) The progress report needs to be prepared in the form of a comparative statement depicting the progress and growth of different activities as compared to the last year/corresponding period figures.
 - (ii) Chairperson, RCI to review and monitor the inspection/approval cases on weekly basis.
 - (iii) All the pending 222 cases of inspection must be cleared immediately and the process of giving approval/rejection be completed and conveyed to the concerned institutions latest by 15th April, 2014 so that the academic session commences on time.
 - (iv) Inspection system including the time frame for inspection and report submission and the inspection format needs to be re-visited so as to avoid delay in inspection and submission of inspection reports by the visiting experts.

- (v) Inspection Reports received after seven days of inspection should be treated as null and void.
 - (vi) Guidelines need to be developed for each parameter. The provision of making a special school mandatory by each institute needs to be re-looked in view of the inclusive education being promoted under SSA/RTE.
 - (vii) Warning to be issued to the defaulting visiting experts and strict action taken against them.
 - (viii) Feasibility of getting individual inspection reports by the visiting experts separately may also be explored as the delay is stated to have been made due to writing of joint reports by them.
 - (ix) TA/DA should not be paid to the visiting experts unless the inspection report has been received and accepted by the Council.
 - (x) Inspection Reports, including the names of the faculty and their CRR registration number to be uploaded on RCI website for maintaining transparency and check on the institutions to fulfill the norms for running a course.
 - (xi) Monitoring system for maintaining standards and quality of training in approved institutions needs to be strengthened.
 - (xii) A proposal to put the AMAS in the public domain should be submitted to the next meeting of the General Council.
 - (xiii) Monitoring of the examinations of Certificate/Diploma courses conducted by RCI through National Institutes/outside Agencies needs to be strengthened so as to avoid mass copying and unfair means during examination.
 - (xiv) "No Objection Certificate" proforma needs to be revised, especially with regard to the column of "existence of the Institute". Guidelines for State Governments for NOC should be put up in the next Board meeting. The directions can be issued by the Department of Disability Affairs, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment also. A meeting of State Social Welfare Secretaries is being held by the Department of Disability Affairs on 28th April, 2014 and RCI to put up an agenda item for that meeting on the subject.
 - (xv) Surprise inspection of approved institutions can be started by RCI. A sub-committee can be formed from GC/EC members to undertake surprise visit of the approved institutions to see the problems and find their solution.
3. The issue of re-constitution of the Executive Committee was deferred in view of enforcement of the code of conduct for the General Elections for Lok Sabha.
 4. General Council authorized the Chairperson, RCI to re-constitute the Expert Committees from the list of experts available with RCI, bio-data called by RCI through

an advertisement issued in the newspapers and from amongst the GC members. Two additional Expert Committees on Distance Education and Vocational Education may also be constituted. Meetings of the Expert Committees should be held at least twice a year or as and when required.

5. The Scheme for Implementation of Special Component Plan for Scheduled Castes during 2013-14 was approved by the General Council with the following recommendations:
 - (a) The Scheme for Implementation of Special Component Plan for Scheduled Castes should be announced and placed on RCI website giving one month time to SC students to apply for the Scheme.
 - (b) General Council authorized the Chairperson, RCI to make criteria for giving Laptops to SC students proposed under the Scheme. First preference may be given to the Post Graduate students and students with disabilities. Senior most students should be considered first.
 - (c) RCI to get authentic data of SC students, SC students with disabilities, SC female students and SC female student with disabilities from the approved institutions.
 - (d) After successful implementation of the Scheme for SC students, RCI can approach the Ministry for allocation of funds for such a Scheme for ST students also. For this purpose, similar data may be generated for ST students as well.

6. General Council approved the proposal for fixation of allowances and facilities to Prof. (Mrs.) Sudesh Mukhopadhyay, Chairperson, RCI and submit it to the Department of Disability Affairs for approval as per their order No. 25-10/2004-DD.III

(Pt.) dated 18.02.2014. The General Council also recommended for amendment in the RCI Act, 1992 (as amended in 2000) to make provision for payment of salary and allowances to the Chairperson, RCI equal to the Secretary to the Government of India keeping in view the duties and responsibilities cast on Chairperson by the RCI Act and RCI Regulations and similar status given to Chairperson of other statutory bodies like National Trust for Empowerment of Persons with Autism, Cerebral Palsy, Mental Retardation and Multiple Disabilities, NCTE, AICTE, etc.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

To fulfill the purpose of the RCI Act, the General Council as per the powers conferred under Sub-Section (1) of Section 7, the Chairperson, RCI constituted the Executive Committee from amongst the members of the General Council. The Executive Committee is responsible for the management and administration of the affairs of the Council. The Executive Committee of the Council shall meet at least once in every four months. The meeting of the Executive Committee may be convened by the Chairperson of the Executive Committee or any other member of the Executive Committee who may be authorized by him on his behalf. List of the Executive Committee Members as on 31.03.2014 is placed at *Annexure 1.2*. Two meetings of the Executive Committee were held during the year as per details given below.

64th Meeting of the Executive Committee

64th Meeting of the Executive Committee (EC) was held on 9th July, 2013 at India International Centre, New Delhi and chaired by JS (DA) in the absence of Chairperson, RCI. Following decisions were taken in the meeting:

1. Minutes of the 63rd Meeting of EC were confirmed with the observations that the issue of fixation of salary and allowances to Chairperson, RCI which was being raised for many years in EC & GC meetings may be decided by the Department of Disability Affairs early.
2. Follow up action on the Minutes of the 63rd Meeting of EC was noted and approved by the Executive Committee with the following observations:
 - (i) The Council should make efforts to generate its own funds as the allocation under Non-Plan is not likely to increase. The Plan funds should not be diverted to Non-Plan. Utilization of funds be effectively monitored so that these are fully utilized.
 - (ii) JS & FA, Department of Disability Affairs informed that the unspent amount at the end of the last year would be deducted from this year's budget as per the guidelines of the Ministry of Finance. He advised that corrective action should be taken by RCI to ensure that the allocated funds are fully utilized. He also said that for the current year, 80% of the grants released so far must be utilized by August, 2013 so that the next installment of grant can be released in September.

- (iii) Action Plan should be drawn in such a manner that the funds are utilized in time so that full amount of the grant is released.
3. Progress Report for the period September, 2012 to May, 2013 was perused by the members and following decisions were taken:
- (a) It was decided that monthly targets for each activity be fixed in advance and the responsibility for achieving the targets be given to the concerned department/section head.
 - (b) Regarding sanction of Continuing Rehabilitation Education (CRE) programmes to institutions, it was decided that CRE programmes with funding should be sanctioned so that every RCI approved institution gets the sanction at least once in two years. It should be mandatory for the institutions to organize CRE programmes each year. At least 50% institutions should conduct CRE programmes every year. If necessary, two or more Institutions may collaborate to conduct the CRE programmes. There should be flexibility in allowing CRE programmes on topics that are not in the approved list. A circular may be issued to all the institutions inviting proposals for CRE programmes and a plan of action may be prepared for sanction so that the allocated funds are utilized fully. If need be, more funds may be provided for this purpose. The plan of action may be placed before the next meeting of the Executive Committee.
4. Action Plan for the year 2013-14 was approved and the following decisions were taken:
- (a) Responsibility for implementation of the Action Plan may be assigned to the concerned officers and a system of accountability be put in place.
 - (b) The activities that are carried out and the achievement of targets together with the funds spent thereon should be reported to the EC & GC.
5. Member Secretary stated that after unilateral termination of MoU by IGNOU for conducting the Semester/Term end Examinations for the academic session 2012-13 for Certificate/Diploma Courses, the work has been entrusted to the National Institutes, namely, Ali Yavar Jung National Institute for the Hearing Handicapped, National Institute for the Mentally Handicapped, National Institute for the Orthopedically Handicapped, National Institute for the Visually Handicapped and National Institute for Empowerment of Persons with Multiple Disabilities for the courses of their respective disabilities .
6. The matter of making the National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation (NBER) functional was discussed and the Joint Secretary, Department of Disability Affairs informed that the matter was under consideration in the Department of Disability Affairs and RCI should submit full justification along with income generation from the Board to the Department.

7. Executive Committee approved the syllabi of the following Courses:
 - (a) P.G. Diploma in Augmentative and Alternative Communication (PGDAAC).
 - (b) Diploma in Inclusive Education.
 - (c) P.G. Diploma in Development Therapy (Multiple Disabilities – Physical & Neurological).
8. Executive Committee approved the model guidelines for issuance of “No Objection Certificate” (NOC) by the State Governments /UTs for running RCI approved courses. EC suggested that the response of the State Governments/UTs may be reviewed after six months.
9. Executive Committee was also informed that the last date for receipt of proposals for approval of new courses/extension of courses was advanced from 31st December to 31st October from academic session 2013-14. Therefore, 31st January, 2013 was fixed as the last date for submission of NOC from the State Governments/UTs by the institutions. Recognizing the difficulties in getting NOC, the Executive Committee decided that NOCs received from Institutions upto 30th June, 2013 may be accepted and the proposals be processed for deputing inspection teams. The institutions whose cases have already been regretted for non-submission of NOC by 31st January, 2013 but had submitted NOC before 30th June, 2013, may also be considered for deputing inspection teams.
10. The Executive Committee gave in principle approval to the proposal of running courses through Pilot mode. However, it was decided that the parameters should be fixed for accepting an institution as a 'reputed institution' by 15th August 2013. Suggestions for the same should also be invited from the members of the Executive Committee and if need be, a meeting be held.
11. Executive Committee was informed that there were five proposals (four from government institutions and one from non-governmental institution) for retrospective approval for regularization of previous batches for which prior approval to conduct the same had not been obtained from the Council. It was decided that the case of each institution seeking retrospective approval should be examined in detail. Details with regard to the Course offered, list of faculty, list of students, etc., should be obtained as soon as possible. After examination of full details, the matter may again be brought before the Executive Committee for consideration.
12. Members also expressed concern about the Institutions/Universities running courses without approval of RCI. It was decided that a list of Institutions which are running RCI approved Courses without its approval should be prepared and appropriate action (e.g. filing FIRs) should be taken against them. The matter may be placed before the Executive Committee in its next meeting.

13. Executive Committee approved the proposal for fixing period of approvals based on the weightage points with the following modifications:-

14. The proposal for issue of digitalized Central Rehabilitation Register (CRR) Certificate and CRR Card was approved by the Executive Committee.
15. The proposal for revision of registration fee, as given below, was approved by the Executive Committee:

16. Executive Committee approved the proposal to fix the last date for receipt of proposals as 31st August each year instead of 31st October. It was also decided that for the academic year 2014-15, RCI would write to all the institutions informing them about the change of date notwithstanding that it has been mentioned in the advertisements in the newspapers and it has been put on the RCI website.

65th Meeting of the Executive Committee

65th Meeting of the Executive Committee was held on 01.10.2013 at RCI, New Delhi. Following decisions were taken in the meeting:

1. Follow up action taken on the Minutes of the 64th Meeting was approved with the following observations/decisions:
 - (i) Second installment of grant-in-aid could not be released to RCI by 30th September, 2013 as the utilization certificate in the prescribed format had been submitted on 4th September, 2013 and only partial information on the study on

Central Autonomous bodies by NIFM, Faridabad had been given. It was clarified that the required information has since been uploaded on NIFM's website on 24.09.2013 under intimation to the Ministry.

- (ii) Deputy Director (T), RCI informed the Executive Committee that 57 inspection reports were still awaited from the experts who were deputed for inspection between March and June, 2013. There were primarily three reasons for delay in submission of inspection reports by inspectors, viz. (i) inspectors/experts were not able to get leave from their respective departments/organizations, (ii) due to mismatch between the inspection date fixed by experts and the concerned institute, and (iii) due to mismatch between the inspection date decided by the respective experts. The Executive Committee viewed the delay seriously and took the following decisions to expedite the process of approval:
- (a) Inspection Reports from the experts in respect of above 57 institutions inspected before 30th September, 2013 only should be accepted. No report should be accepted from such experts where inspections are done after 30th September, 2013.
 - (b) Inspection orders for all the 57 cases for which inspection was not done by 30th September, 2013, should be cancelled and re-allotted to other experts with strict instructions to complete the inspection and submit the inspection reports latest by 21st October, 2013. Revised inspection orders may be issued by 7th of October, 2013.
 - (c) Names of Experts/Inspectors who have failed to carry out inspection in respect of above mentioned 57 cases should be deleted from the list of inspectors and they should not be deputed for conducting inspection for 5 years. In any case, it was directed that all pending inspections should be expedited.
 - (d) As regards 13 Inspection Reports indicated as under process, the same be cleared within a week and orders issued latest by 07.10.2013.
2. Revised Estimates (RE) (Plan & Non-Plan) for the year 2013-14 and Budget Estimates (BE) for the year 2014-15 (Non-Plan) were approved.
 3. Regarding transfer of allocated amount of Rs. 60 lakhs from the Special Component Plan for Scheduled Castes to General Grant for the year 2013-14, it was informed that such transfer was not possible and will not be allowed. Hence, it was decided that RCI should prepare a detailed proposal to utilize the allocated grant of Rs. 60 lakhs under Special Component Plan for Scheduled Castes fully during 2013-14. It was suggested by JS (DA) that, to begin with, a Scheme for Laptop Grant for SC students studying at post graduate level and Book Grant to SC students studying at undergraduate level in RCI approved institutions may be formulated indicating the procedure for its

implementation. Any other proposal which can benefit Scheduled Castes students may also be considered. The Scheme, after due diligence, may be placed before the next meeting of the Executive Committee/General Council for approval.

4. The proposal to enhance the existing registration fees of Rs. 500/- for foreign qualification to Rs. 5000/- was approved which would be effective from 1st November, 2013. It was also decided that all the pending cases for registration of candidates with foreign qualifications be finalized within three weeks, latest by 30th October, 2013.
5. Considering that the expenditure incurred by the Council on processing the proposals and inspection of institutions has considerably increased during the last years, following rates of fee were approved by the Executive Committee:

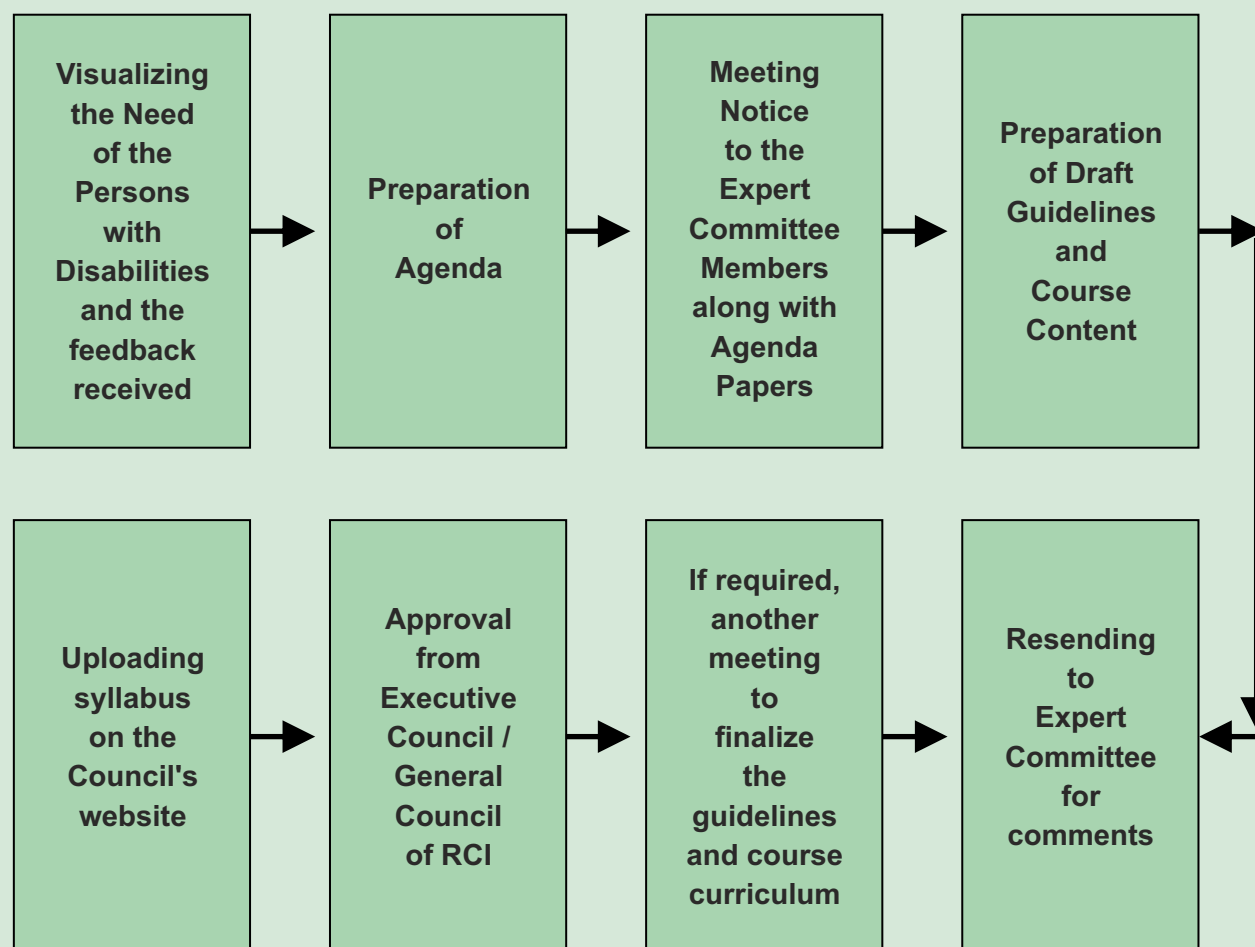

CHAPTER 2

EXPERT COMMITTEES AND STANDARDIZATION OF TRAINING COURSES

Rehabilitation Council of India develops and standardizes training courses to meet the human resource requirement for various categories of professionals/personnel. These courses are reviewed, revised and updated from time to time. Expert Committees and Core Committees play a significant role in designing, developing, reviewing and updating the courses. At present 63 courses are operational through regular mode in the area of disability rehabilitation and special education and the list of courses is given at *Annexure 2.1*.

Following procedure is followed by the Council for development and standardization of courses in the field of disability rehabilitation and special education:



During the year, RCI conducted six Expert/Core Committee meetings and revised the norms, guidelines and contents of the following courses:

- (i) Diploma in Education Special Education (HI)
- (ii) Diploma in Education Special Education (MR)
- (iii) Diploma in Education Special Education (VI)
- (iv) Diploma in Education Special Education (ASD)
- (v) Diploma in Education Special Education (Db)
- (vi) Diploma in Education Special Education (CP)
- (vii) Diploma in Early Childhood Special Education (MR)
- (viii) Diploma in Early Childhood Special Education (HI)
- (ix) Diploma in Prosthetics and Orthotics
- (x) Certificate Course in Prosthetics and Orthotics
- (xi) Master of Prosthetics and Orthotics

The above said courses will be circulated during 2014-15 to the respective Expert Committees for their comments/approval through post/email.

The following new courses were developed and standardized by the Council on pilot basis:

- (i) Post Graduate Diploma in Augmentative and Alternative Communication
- ii) Diploma in Education (Inclusive Education)

The following new courses are in the process of development and standardization by the Council:

- (i) Diploma in Computer Education (VI)
- (ii) Certificate Course in Communication Option- Oral Aural
- (iii) Certificate Course in Communication Option- Total Communication
- (iv) Certificate Course in Communication Option- Bilingualism- Sign Language

EXPERT COMMITTEES/CORE COMMITTEES

To carry out the purposes of the RCI Act, the Council has constituted various Expert Committees under Sub-Section (1) of Section 7 of the RCI Act. List of the existing Expert Committees is placed at *Annexures 2.2 to 2.14*. The objectives of the Expert Committees are as follows:

- (i) To recommend the courses, the duration of the courses, subjects for examinations and standards of the proficiency to be obtained in any Universities or institutions for grant of recognized rehabilitation qualifications.

- (ii) To recommend to the Council, the standards of the staff, equipment, accommodation, training and other facilities for study or training of the rehabilitation professionals/personnel.
- (iii) Any other matter related to the above issues.

The details of the meetings of the Expert/Core Committees conducted during the period along with gist of the discussion and decisions taken are given below:

Meeting of Expert Committee for the Development of Training Programmes for four Categories of Professionals, namely, Rehabilitation Administrators, Community Based Rehabilitation Professionals, Multipurpose Rehabilitation Therapists/Technicians and Rehabilitation Engineers/Technicians

A meeting of the Expert Committee was held on 22-23 April, 2013 at RCI, New Delhi. The gist of the discussions and the decisions taken is as under:

1. Minutes of the previous meeting of the Experts Committee were approved.
2. Syllabi of Diploma in Community Based Rehabilitation (DCBR) and Post Graduate Diploma in Community Based Rehabilitation (PGDCBR) Courses have been revised and the duration of the DCBR course was increased to two academic years (including three months internship in the community).
3. Posts should be identified for DCBR candidates in the government and NGO sector and job opportunities need to be created for them. RCI to write to State Governments for creating posts for these professionals so that they can be absorbed in the government sector.
4. RCI to take up the matter with the Directorate General of Employment and Training (DGE&T) to consider the DCBR candidates to work as Vocational Instructors at Vocational Rehabilitation Centres. DGE&T should also be requested to give manpower coding to these professionals enabling them to register in the Employment Exchanges for employment in government sector.

Meeting of Core Committee on Visual Impairment

A meeting of the Core Committee on Visual Impairment was held on 29-30 April, 2013 at National Council of Educational Research & Training (NCERT), New Delhi to review and finalize D.Ed. Spl. Ed. (VI) course curriculum. After detailed discussions, the experts modified/revised the course content and the guidelines of D.Ed. Spl. Ed. (VI) course. The revised contents have been incorporated in the syllabus and the same will be placed before the Expert Committee for approval.

Meeting of Core Committee on Hearing Impairment

A meeting of the Core Committee on Hearing Impairment was held on 26-27 November, 2013 at RCI to review the course curriculum of Diploma in Teaching Young (Deaf & Hard of Hearing). The gist of the discussions and the decisions taken by the Core Committee is as under:

1. The nomenclature of the course will now be Diploma in Early Childhood Special Education (Hearing Impairment)/ DECSE (HI).
2. It was recommended that the minimum eligibility criteria for admission to DECSE (HI) be made as 50% in the qualifying examination.
3. The Core Committee members discussed and developed the outline of the optional paper on Indian Sign Language in place of Fundamentals of Speech and Speech Teaching (as an exceptional case) for a student with hearing impairment of Montfort Centre for Education, Tura.
4. After receiving the modified syllabus, the same will be circulated among the expert committee members for their comments/approval within a specific time frame.

Meeting of Core Committee on Mental Retardation

A meeting of the Core Committee on Mental Retardation was held on 11-12 December, 2013 at RCI to review the Diploma in Early Childhood Special Education (Mental Retardation) course curriculum. The gist of the discussions and the decisions taken is as under:

1. It was recommended that the minimum eligibility criteria for admission to Diploma in Early Childhood Special Education (MR)/DECSE(MR) be made as 50% in the qualifying examination.
2. The modified syllabus will be circulated among the expert committee members through e-mail for their comments/approval.
3. The Core Committee members also developed two methodology papers of D.Ed. Spl. Ed. (MR). After finalization of the core paper (which is common to all D.Ed. Spl. Ed. courses), the revised syllabus will be circulated to expert committee members for their comments/approval within a specific time frame.

Meeting of Core Committee (Cross Disability)

A meeting of the Core Committee consisting of experts from different areas of disability was held on 17th December, 2013 at RCI to finalize common papers of D.Ed. Spl. Ed. of all disability specializations. After detailed discussions, the experts modified/revised the common papers of D.Ed. Spl Ed. Hearing Impairment, Visual Impairment, Mental Retardation, Autism

Spectrum Disorders, Cerebral Palsy and Deafblindness (HI/VI/MR/ASD/CP/Db). The revised common papers have been incorporated in the respective syllabi.

Meeting of Core Committee on Prosthetics and Orthotics

A meeting of the Core Committee on Prosthetics and Orthotics was held on 23-24 January, 2014 at RCI to review the course curricula of Certificate Course in Prosthetics and Orthotics, Diploma in Prosthetics and Orthotics and Master in Prosthetics and Orthotics. The gist of the discussions and the decisions taken is as under:

1. In view of the representations received from the students of BPO, internship of six months duration will be introduced in the present BPO syllabus and the internship will be applicable to the students admitted from the academic session 2010-11 onwards. The Council will issue a circular to all concerned institutions in this regard.
2. It was unanimously decided that the duration of the DPO course will be 2 years from 2014-15 onwards. The Core Committee reviewed CPO, DPO and MPO courses as per the present need and recent developments and the same will be circulated to respective Expert Committee members for their comments/approval within a specific time.
3. There was no consensus among the Core Committee members regarding restarting the Condensed Bridge Course in Prosthetics and Orthotics. Hence, the matter will be referred to the Expert Committee along with revised syllabi of CPO, DPO and MPO courses for their comments/approval within a specific time frame.

CHAPTER 3**CONTINUING REHABILITATION EDUCATION
& OTHER ACTIVITIES**

RCI is responsible for updating and upgrading the knowledge and skills of professionals/personnel working in different areas of disability. The objectives of Continuing Rehabilitation Education (CRE) programmes are as given below:

1. To upgrade the knowledge & skills of in-service & practicing Rehabilitation Professionals & Personnel already registered with the RCI under section 19 of the RCI Act of 1992.
2. To update professional knowledge of master trainers working in the field of rehabilitation & special education.

Norms and Guidelines to Conduct CRE Programmes

RCI develops norms and guidelines to conduct CRE programmes. These were last revised in 2011-12 and are available at the RCI website. Following norms and guidelines have been prescribed for approval/sanction of Continuing Rehabilitation Education (CRE) programmes:

- (i) Institute must have 2 years of experience in offering RCI approved course to be eligible for conducting a CRE programme. This condition can be relaxed in the case of J&K and North East where CRE programmes can be organized with the recommendation of National Institutes and Zonal Coordination Committees of RCI.
- (ii) CRE points are awarded for 1 day/2 days/3 days/4 days/5 days programmes with 6 hours of actual training excluding lunch break.
- (iii) The candidate may choose any topic of interest from the approved list of topics irrespective of his/her professional area of disability. However, the institutions should be given the option to conduct CREs on the topics which are not included in the list of approved topics if they meet the needs of professionals and persons with disabilities. The institutions are required to submit a detailed proposal covering the following items:
 - (a) Background (highlighting the need of the programme)
 - (b) Aim
 - (c) Detailed content of the programme with name (s) of the resource person(s)
 - (d) Methodology
 - (e) Desired outcome

- (iv) For according CRE status to various Seminars/Conferences/Workshops and other programmes, following information/documents have to be supplied at least two months before the scheduled dates:
 - (a) Background and theme
 - (b) Aim
 - (c) Detailed content of the programme
 - (d) List of resource persons – content-wise
 - (e) Expected outcome of the programme.
- (v) All CRE programmes will be approved on first come first served basis and financial assistance for conducting CRE programme will be given only once in two financial years. However, there will not be any limit to the number of CREs to be conducted by an institution without financial support, subject to meeting the RCI norms.

Based on the above norms and guidelines, 110 CRE programmes were sanctioned with grant, 131 CRE programmes without grant, CRE status was granted to 71 Seminars/Workshops/Conferences and 389 short-term programmes with CRE status were approved to the National Institutes/CRCs. The details of the CRE programmes, along with name of the institution, topic and date conducted during the year are placed at *Annexure 3.1*.

Other Professional Activities

RCI conducts Seminars/Workshops/Conferences and other programmes with the help of Universities, Institutions, Organizations for updating the knowledge and skills of faculty, professionals and personnel. Refresher Programmes on Research Methodology were conducted during the year with the following objectives:

1. To provide opportunity to faculty members for upgrading their knowledge and skills in learning advances in research methodology in disability rehabilitation.
2. To acquaint with the qualitative and quantitative techniques in data collection, analysis and processing.
3. To familiarize the participants with computer applications – Statistical Packages for Social Science (SPSS) in disability rehabilitation and special education.

The programmes were conducted in collaboration with following Universities:

1. Department of Psychology, University of Calcutta, Kolkata.
2. Department of Special Education, SNDT Women's University, Mumbai.
3. Department of Special Education, Avinashlingam University, Coimbatore.
4. Department of Psychology, Jai Narayan Vyas University, Jodhpur.

One hundred and fifty faculty members from RCI approved institutions benefited from this programme.

CHAPTER 4

EXAMINATION CELL AND OTHER ACTIVITIES

EXAMINATION CELL

RCI gives approval to the Institutions/Organizations/Universities to conduct various Courses from Certificate level to M.Phil. level. While the examinations for the Bachelors degree and Masters degree level programmes are conducted by the respective affiliating Universities, examinations for the Certificate and Diploma level courses are being conducted by RCI to maintain uniformity in examination of such courses.

Accordingly, to conduct, streamline and bring uniformity in the examination of Diploma and Certificate level courses approved by RCI, an Examination Cell was set up in RCI in 2005 – 06 and the Manipal University was entrusted the work of conducting examination of Certificate and Diploma level courses from the academic session 2005-06, on behalf of the Council. Subsequently, the examination work was given to Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) from the academic session 2010-11 to 2011-12.

The work of conducting the examination for Diploma/Certificate courses from the academic session 2012-13 has been entrusted to the National Institutes (AYJNIHH, Mumbai; NIMH, Secunderabad; NIOH, Kolkata; NIVH, Dehradun and NIEPMD, Chennai).

Details of the activities undertaken by the Examination Cell during the year are given below:

ALL INDIA APTITUDE TEST

An All India Aptitude Test for admission to Diploma in Education, Special Education (Deaf & Hard of Hearing, Mental Retardation, Visual Impairment, Autism Spectrum Disorder, Cerebral Palsy and Deafblindness) was held on 8th July, 2013. The result was declared on 8th August, 2013. Of the 12,769 candidates enrolled, only 9,700 appeared in AIAT. For 6,325 seats, a merit list of 8,083 candidates with 35% as cut off mark was prepared and shared at RCI website.

CONDUCT OF EXAMINATION FOR CERTIFICATE/DIPLOMA COURSES

RCI approves courses that are affiliated to the Universities. Admissions and examinations for such courses are conducted by the respective Universities. However, the work of conduct of examination for Diploma/Certificate courses from the academic session 2012-13 was entrusted to the National Institutes (AYJNIHH, Mumbai; NIMH, Secunderabad; NIOH, Kolkata; NIVH, Dehradun and NIEPMD, Chennai). The National Institutes have completed

the Semester/Term End Examinations and declared the results as per details given below:-

NATIONAL BOARD OF EXAMINATION IN REHABILITATION (NBER)

In exercise of the powers conferred by Sub-section (k) of Section 29 of the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (34 of 1992), draft Regulations for Conduct of Examinations, Qualifications of Examiners, and the Condition of Admission to such Examinations were approved by the General Council in the meeting held on 28th November, 2013 and the same have been submitted to the Department of Disability Affairs, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, on 10th December, 2013 for approval and notification so that NBER can be made functional.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

RCI launched Navshikhar and Punarbhava Webportal projects in the year 2007. Programme Division has been given the responsibility for monitoring and implementation of these projects.

NAVSHIKHAR CHANNEL

The EDUSAT network was established in July, 2007 by setting up a Studio at RCI and installation of Direct Receiving System (DRS) in the approved institutes/centres in a phased manner. The setting up of studio, operations and programme generation was funded by the Media Lab Asia (MLA). Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) had provided uplink equipment for the Earth Station and access of bandwidth on EDUSAT satellite. The independent channel on disability was inaugurated on October 05, 2007 and named as "Navshikhar Channel". Since then regular transmission of programmes in various disability areas were carried out till its closure in October, 2013.

Live/recorded programmes were telecast on different topics in the field of disability to 680 institutions/centers, where the Direct Reception System (DRS) facility was provided by the Council, from Monday to Friday between 10.30 a.m. to 05.00 p.m. CDs of live teleconferencing programmes telecast on various topics in the field of disability rehabilitation and special education were regularly uploaded on the Punarbhava web portal in collaboration with Media Lab Asia.

List of live teleconferencing programmes telecast between 1st April, 2013 to 30th September, 2013 is given at *Annexure 4.1*.

Since the Media Lab Asia (MLA) discontinued financial support to the project and there was no alternative source of funding, the channel was discontinued from 1st October, 2013. However, a proposal has been submitted to the Department of Disability Affairs, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment for telecast of programmes through Doordarshan.

NATIONAL INTERACTIVE WEB PORTAL "PUNARBHAVA" ON DISABILITY

Rehabilitation Council of India in collaboration with Media Lab Asia started an interactive and informative web portal "Punarbhava" (www.punarbhava.in) on disability and rehabilitation in the year 2007. The purpose of the webportal is to fill the gap of availability of information and its dissemination for persons with disabilities. The webportal has opened new horizons for persons with disabilities. This is an innovative initiative where two government organizations have joined hands for reaching the unreached and providing them opportunities to fully participate in social life and become productive members of the society.

Punarbhava is an attempt to provide a gateway to information for persons with disabilities and all others concerned with this sector. It is a recognized fact that information holds the key to knowledge, which in turn enables and empowers people and this initiative of Media Lab Asia in collaboration with Rehabilitation Council of India, is envisioned as a medium for persons with disabilities and all related stakeholders to be empowered and to participate fully in the national mainstream. Latest and updated information was uploaded on Punarbhava regularly under different heads like national disability register, legal instrument resources/publications, RCI programmes, careers for persons with disabilities, national and international news in the field of disability, event calendar, research articles, assistive devices, data collection /NGO registration form, update on Navshikhar Channel, CDs on lecture series of Navshikhar, etc.

CHAPTER 5

INSPECTION & RECOGNITION
OF INSTITUTIONS

As per the provisions of Section 11(2) of RCI Act of 1992 and Section 7(3)(h) of its regulations, online proposals from the prospective government organizations (GOs)/non-governmental organizations (NGOs) to conduct RCI approved training courses are invited by RCI every year, generally in the month of June. Accordingly, inspections are carried out by a team of experts for grant of permission to run courses on fulfillment of prescribed norms and RCI recommends to Government for recognition to run training courses in the field of special education and disability rehabilitation.

During the year, teams of visiting experts were deputed by RCI to conduct inspection of 540 training programmes (369 extension of approval and 171 new proposals). The total number of approved/recognized institutions increased from 453 to 493, conducting 937 batches (batches denotes Courses from Certificate to M.Phil. level) of training programmes as on 31st March, 2014. List of approved institutions as on 31.3.2014 is placed at *Annexure 5.1*. Details of the activities undertaken during the year are given below:

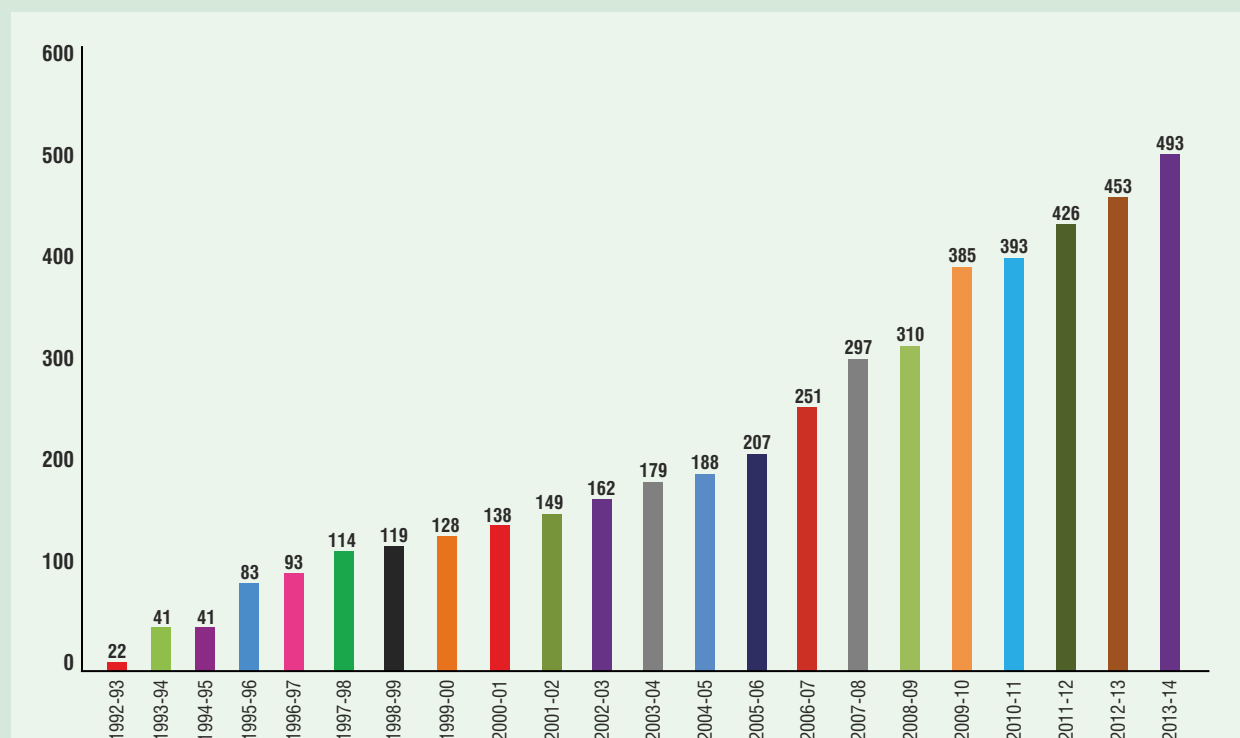

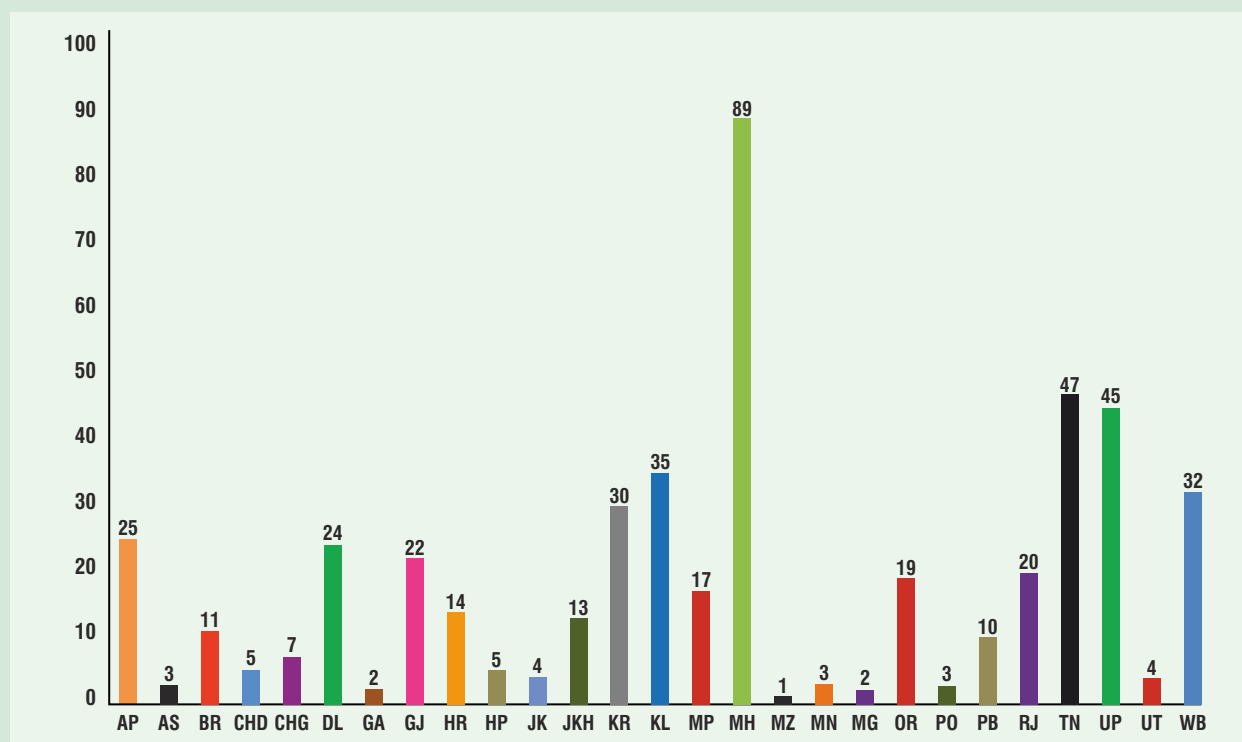

Revision of Existing Inspection Report Formats (New & Ongoing)

Existing Joint Inspection Report Formats (New & Ongoing Courses) and general as well as specific guidelines for each format were revised in a meeting held on 12th November, 2013 at RCI. The revised draft inspection report formats were presented in the two-day 'Orientation Programme for the Coordinators/Faculty of RCI approved training institutions' held on 20-21 December, 2013 at Guwahati. Based on the feedback and suggestions received from the participants, necessary modifications were incorporated in both the formats. The Chairperson, RCI approved the final Inspection Report formats on 30th January, 2014 for its implementation with effect from the academic session 2014-15. After approval, joint inspection report formats (new & ongoing courses) along with general as well as specific guidelines were uploaded on RCI website for information of the public concerned.

Enhancement of Intake from 25 to 30

As per the decision taken in the 65th Meeting of the Executive Committee, a circular regarding enhancement of additional intake of 05 seats per batch from the existing capacity of 25 to 30 in respect of Certificate, Diploma & Degree level courses, with effect from the academic session 2014-15, was uploaded on the Council's website on 11th October, 2013. Based on the undertaking submitted by the concerned institute stating that there will be no drop in standards by maintaining necessary required facilities, 174 batches of Courses of 101 institutions have been granted approval for additional intake of 05 seats per batch from the academic session 2014-15.

TWO-DAY NATIONAL INTERACTIVE MEET – SUMMIT OF MIND-2014

RCI organized a 'Two-day National Interactive Meet of Heads of the RCI approved Institutions - Summit of Mind' on 7-8 February, 2014 at New Delhi. Since, the Parliamentary session was on, the inauguration was held in the afternoon. Hon'ble Chief Guest, Shri P. Balram Naik, Minister of State, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India inaugurated the two-day National Interactive Meet. Shri T. D. Dhariyal, Member Secretary, RCI presented the welcome address. Maj. Gen. (Retd.) Ian Cardozo, AVSM, SM, Chairman, RCI delivered an overview of the status of human resources in disability sector and objectives of the Meet. Smt. Stuti Kacker, Secretary, Department of Disability Affairs and Shri Awanish K. Awasthi, Joint Secretary (DA), Department of Disability Affairs addressed the participants and informed them about the schemes and programmes of the Department of Disability Affairs and invited suggestions for reaching the un-reached through various programmes of the Department and RCI.

Hon'ble Chief Guest addressed the delegates and appreciated the efforts of the Council for organizing the Meet. He also stressed the need for involvement of State governments in education, training and rehabilitation of children with special needs (CWSN) and persons with disabilities (PwDs) and also to extend financial support to NGOs. Dr. Subodh Kumar, Dy. Director (Acads.), RCI proposed the vote of thanks.

Objectives of the National Interactive Meet were as under:

- (i) Create awareness about various issues concerning human resource development in the disability sector among the heads of institutions.
- (ii) Get feedback from the heads of institutions about their needs with regard to

approvals, their constraints, and suggestions for improvement of quality and increasing the number of professionals in the country to meet the growing demand.

- (iii) Understand the expectations of the heads of institutions from RCI, Department of Disability Affairs, MoSJ&E, State Govts., etc.
- (iv) Seek suggestions from institutions with regard to norms for various courses, process of approvals – deputing of visiting experts, conduct of inspections and compliance with shortcomings and make the system more clients friendly.

Recommendations

The following recommendations emerged from the two day National Meet:

- State Governments should create a cadre of special education teachers and posts for special education teachers required for education of children with disabilities and should be created at the State level.
- Budget for salary and allowances of special education teachers should be allocated to the State Governments so as to bring them at par with general education teachers.
- Each State should form a Working Committee to look after the issue of human resource development in rehabilitation and special education through Rehabilitation Council of India.
- Best candidates to be attracted for teacher training programmes.

- Government should provide funding for teacher training programmes through RCI.
- Special education teachers should be given good incentives at par with general teachers.
- National Eligibility Test (NET) should be introduced by RCI.
- A Consortium of RCI approved/recognized institutions to be formed to seek financial support from the corporate sector for human resource development in the area of rehabilitation and special education.
- Department of Disability Affairs, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment to take up with the corporate sector to start training institutions for HRD in rehabilitation and special education as is being done by other statutory bodies like AICTE, NCTE, MCI.
- Dr. Bhushan Punani, Executive Director, Blind People's Association, Ahmedabad can organize an orientation course of six-day duration for the heads of institutions to orient them to make proposals for seeking CSR support.
- The nomenclature of the special school may be changed to "Resource Centre".
- RCI should prevail over all Central and State government departments to revise their Recruitment Rules, making it mandatory to have RCI recognized qualifications and registered professionals to be appointed in disability sector by the Govt.
- RCI needs to be given more autonomy to function independently as a statutory body with more powers to work as a strong regulatory body.
- RCI to include ICT for persons with disabilities in all its courses.
- Experiential and lived experience of persons with disabilities should be considered by RCI while framing course curricula of different courses by involving PwDs in expert committees.

The said Meet was conducted at USI Auditorium, Subroto Park, New Delhi where 245 participants from all over the country participated in the said meet.

ALL INDIA COURSE COORDINATORS' MEET

All India Course Coordinators' Meets for Diploma and Degree level courses in Special Education were organized by RCI in two regions of the country in collaboration with the Zonal Coordination Committees (ZCCs) of RCI of East and North-East region. The following issues were discussed during the two-day Meet:

1. Effective utilization of Academic Monitoring and Analysis System (AMAS) of RCI.

2. Orientation towards the revised joint inspection report formats and norms and general guidelines.
3. Issues with regard to implementation of Diploma & Degree level courses in Special Education.

CHAPTER 6

CENTRAL REHABILITATION REGISTER

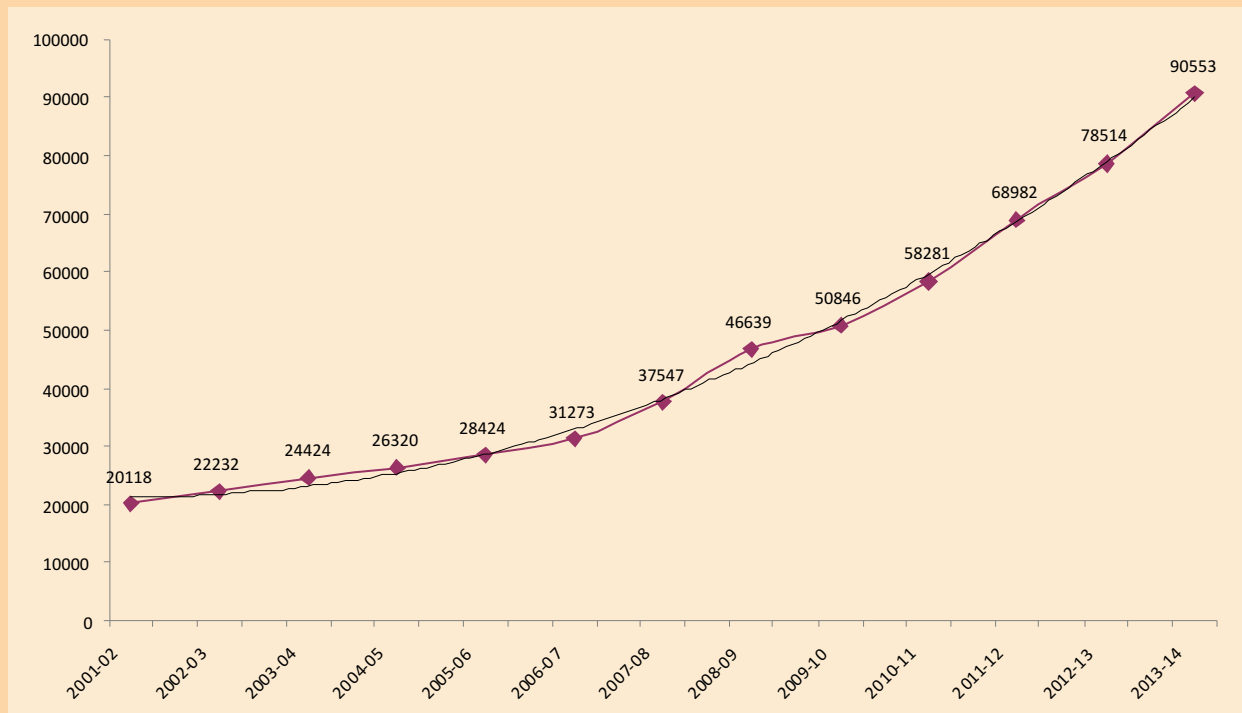
In accordance with Section 23 of the RCI Act, a Central Rehabilitation Register (CRR) is being maintained for registering the professionals/personnel having RCI approved qualifications in disability sector.

During the year, registration has been granted to 12,039 professionals/personnel, out of which number of registered Professionals is 6,007 and 6,032 is in Personnel category. Accordingly, 35,447 Professionals and 55,106 Personnel raising the cumulative total to 90,553 have been registered in the Central Rehabilitation Register as on March 31, 2014. Details of the registration done during the year are given below.

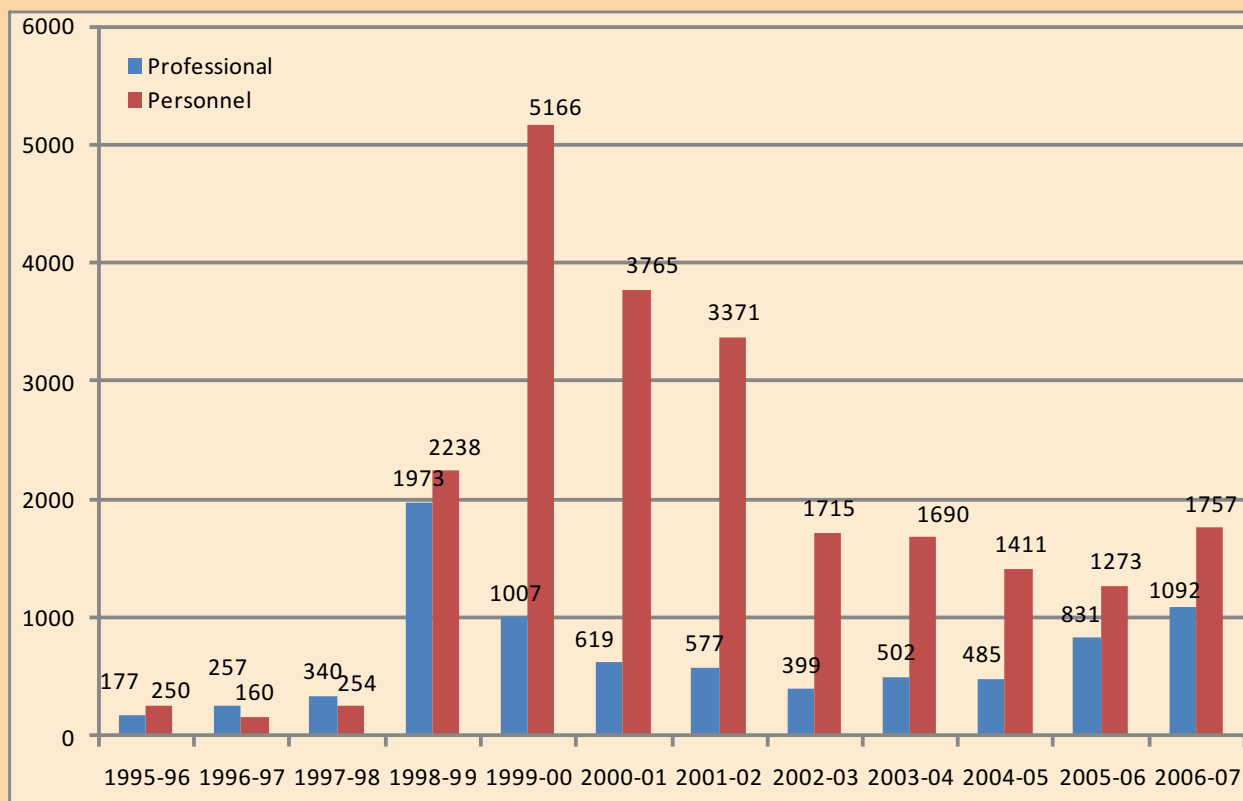

(April 2013 to March 2014)**

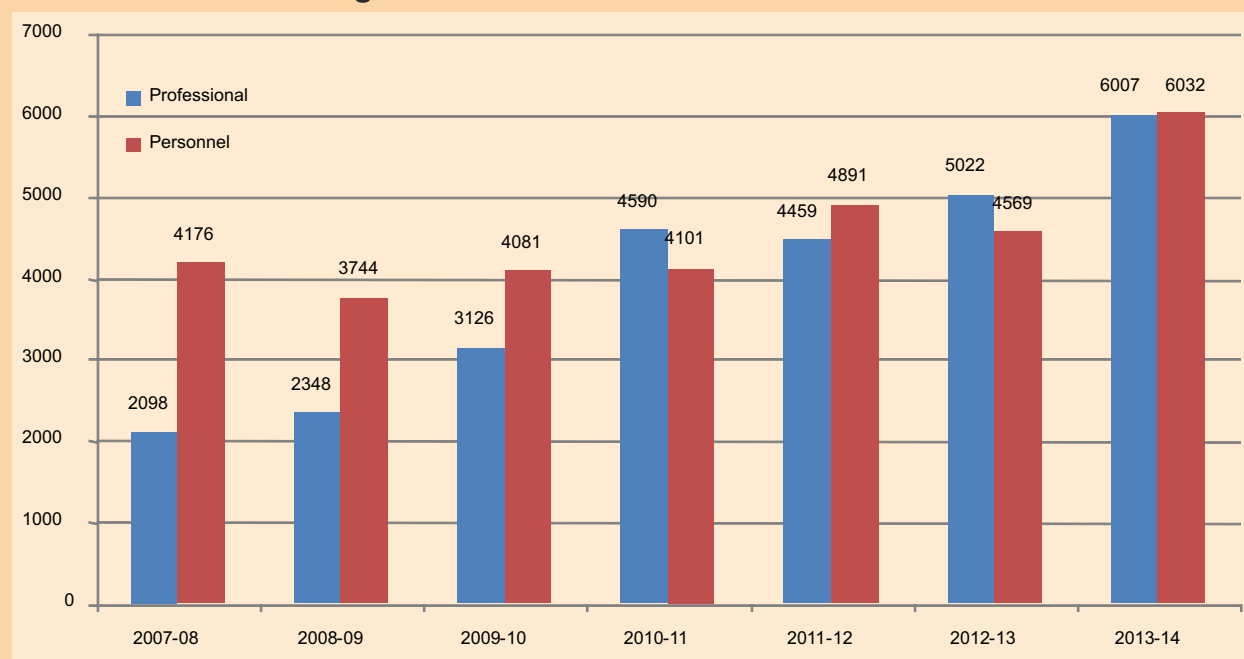

ASSESSMENT & ACCREDITATION COMMITTEE (AAC) MEETING

Assessment & Accreditation Committee (AAC) meeting comprising of eminent experts from various fields of disability that decides the equivalence of foreign qualifications at par with RCI approved qualifications, was held on 6th November, 2013 at RCI to consider the applications received from candidates having foreign qualifications. Sixteen applications with foreign qualifications were placed before the AAC to decide their equivalence to RCI approved qualifications. Applicants were also given a chance to present their credentials and relevant transcripts in respect of their foreign degree/diploma before the Committee. Based on their qualifications and equivalency to the RCI approved courses, 9 applicants were recommended for registration with the Council. Accordingly, registration certificates were issued to 9 applicants and 7 applicants were regretted.

CHAPTER 7

OUTREACH DIVISION

Distance Education Cell

The quality of rehabilitation services received by persons with disabilities is in turn depended upon the quality of education of rehabilitation professionals. As a result, need based special education programmes through distance education mode were initiated by RCI in 2001 as a joint venture with different Open Universities with an aim to develop trained professionals in the field of special education and disability rehabilitation.

The demand for the courses through distance mode increased manifold in due course of time and RCI started receiving requests from various stakeholders such as prospective learners, NGOs, GOs and approved training colleges to launch the teacher training programmes in special education through distance mode in order to bridge the gap between demand and supply.

Accordingly, a Distance Education Cell was set up by RCI in the year 2001 to implement and monitor the teachers' training courses run through distance mode in collaboration with State Open Universities in the country. The first MoU was signed between RCI & Madhya Pradesh Bhoj Open University (MPBOU), Bhopal to conduct B.Ed.-SEDE courses through distance mode in 2001. As per the MoU, RCI started generation of separate revenues in the form of 10% of fee share from the respective Open Universities to sustain the Distance Education Cell. At present, two Programme Officers on contractual basis are deployed at DE Cell to look after the day to day functioning of the DE Cell under the supervision of Dy. Director (Acads.).

As on date, RCI has signed MoUs with 10 State Open Universities to offer the following courses from Certificate to Master level in various specializations:

Renewal of Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)

RCI has signed Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with 10 State Open Universities to conduct Distance Education Courses in Special Education. MoU with Babasaheb Ambedkar Open University, Ahmedabad & Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Open University, Hyderabad has been extended on 26.09.2013 and 25.10.2013 respectively for a period of five years.

Permission has been accorded to Tamil Nadu Open University (TNOU), Chennai to start following new courses with prescribed intake from the academic session 2014-15, to be offered in regional and English language:

1. M.Ed.-SEDE (HI, VI, MR)

3. Foundation Course on Education of Children with Disabilities (FC-SEDE)
4. Foundation Course on Education of Children with Disabilities (FC-SEDE) Learning Disability (LD)

Permission has also been accorded to Netaji Subhash Open University (NSOU), Kolkata to conduct following courses with prescribed intake from the academic session 2014-15, to be offered in regional language:

- a. Foundation Course on Education of Children with Disabilities (FC-SEDE)
- b. Foundation Course on Education of Children with Disabilities (FC-SEDE) Learning Disability (LD)

FOUNDATION COURSE

During the year, RCI revised the strategies for implementation of Foundation Course on Education of Children with Disabilities and FCLD through online, regular and distance mode. As per the revised scheme of Foundation Course, approval has been accorded to four SCERTs/SIEs to conduct the said course(s) through Block Resource Centres (BRCs) and other approved Study Centres in the State of Kerala, Himachal Pradesh, Andaman & Nicobar Islands & Nagaland for a period of 05 years till 31st March, 2018.

Special Permission to Conduct Foundation Courses at Assam under North Eastern Hill University, Shillong

Based on the request of Mission Director, RMSA, Assam, special permission has been granted to the Study Centres under NEHU, Shillong to conduct parallel batches of Foundation Courses with an intake of 50 candidates per batch.

Other Activities

1. In order to resolve various issues like appointment of core faculty for the B.Ed. Spl. Ed. Courses, payment of balance fee share of RCI, revision of Self-Learning

Material (SLM), etc., a meeting was held at MPBOU, Bhopal on 23.08.2013 at Bhopal which was attended by officials from RCI and the issues were sorted out.

2. A meeting to discuss and resolve the issue pertaining to irregularities in implementation of DCBR, PGDCBR and Add on Courses by Bangalore University was organized on 17.09.2013 at Bangalore University. The meeting was attended by Member Secretary, RCI.

ZONAL COORDINATION COMMITTEES (ZCCs)

The Rehabilitation Council of India has adopted a unique method of reaching the grass roots functionaries by establishing Zonal Coordination Committees in collaboration with non-governmental organizations. These Zonal Coordination Committees function as advisory in nature and act as a zonal chapter of the Council. Zonal Coordination Committees in different zones of the country have initiated the process of strengthening the training programmes under their zone by inviting professionals/personnel and NGOs in the workshops/sensitization programmes, etc., being conducted in their respective zones. The Council has been utilizing their services for monitoring of RCI approved training institutions. They are also being encouraged to conduct short-term programmes for grass root level functionaries apart from executives and legislatives. They are also involved in smooth conduct and monitoring of distance mode programmes.

Following programmes were organized by ZCCs during the year:

Workshops/Sensitization Programmes

- A three-day Workshop on 'Autism Identification and Basic Management' was organized in collaboration with Indian Institute of Cerebral Palsy, Kolkata by ZCC (Eastern Zone) for the parents and teachers on 25-27 September, 2013. Thirty one parents/teachers participated in the Workshop.
- A meeting of Chairpersons of Zonal Coordination Committees was organized on 25.11.2013 at RCI to discuss and finalize guidelines for submitting the annual plan of action.

- ZCC Southern Zone-I organized two Workshops at Bangalore on “Successful Indigenous Technologies and Knowledge in the Field of Rehabilitation” on 03.12.2013 and “Inclusion of People with Disabilities in the National Skill Development and Qualification Framework and Micro Credit Activities” on 31.01.2014 for NGOs & Colleges. A total number of 155 participants attended the Workshop.

CHAPTER 8**ADMINISTRATION/ACCOUNTS**

Administration of the Rehabilitation Council of India involves many activities besides managing the establishment and financial aspects.

Use of Hindi in Official Work

In order to promote use of Hindi in official work, the orders/instructions/guidelines issued by the Department of Official Language from time to time are followed strictly by the Council. The employees of RCI are motivated to carry out their official work in Hindi. During the year, RCI celebrated Hindi Pakhwara between 13 and 27 September, 2013 wherein various programmes were conducted and awards were given to employees for participating in various events and to promote use of Hindi. A Committee under the Chairmanship of Member Secretary, RCI has been set up to oversee the implementation of official language in RCI. Quarterly reports on the work done in Hindi were submitted to the Department of Disability Affairs, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment regularly.

Implementation of RTI Act, 2005

Consequent upon the enactment of the RTI Act, 2005, RCI is following the directions and guidelines issued by the Government from time to time. All the requisite information about RCI is displayed on the website of the Council, www.rehabcouncil.nic.in for the general public. During the year, total 264 RTI applications were received, out of which 241 were replied. Eight applications were transferred to other public authorities to provide information. Out of 14 First Appeals received, 12 were disposed off.

Vigilance Awareness Week

Vigilance Awareness Week was observed in RCI from 28th October to 2nd November, 2013. During the period awareness is created among its employees to maintain the transparency and honesty in the official work.

Reservation Policy

The procedure prescribed by the Government to implement the reservation policy in the office of the RCI is followed and due consideration is given for compliance of the orders on reservation issued by the Government from time to time.

Free Health Checkup Camp

A free health checkup camp for all the officers/staff members and their dependents was organized with the cooperation of Rockland Hospital (recognized by CGHS) on 18.04.2013 in RCI.

Training

Two days in-house training programme on Noting and Drafting and Office Procedure was organized in the Council on 14.11.2013 & 17.11.2013 with the cooperation of Institute of Secretariat Training & Management (an attached office of the Department of Personnel & Training, Government of India). In addition, staff was deployed to attend the training courses/workshops from time to time.

Library and Documentation

RCI has a good collection of books/publications/audio video/journals/periodicals in the area of disability rehabilitation and special education which are being used by the professionals/personnel/experts/students.

Publications

RCI brings out a number of publications on regular intervals such as the Journal of the Rehabilitation Council of India (JRCI), Status of Disability in India, RCI Newsletter, Manuals of Diploma Courses, Training Manuals for different functionaries, etc. During the year following publications were brought out:

Staff Strength

Under Section 8 (1) of the RCI Act, 1992, Central Government shall appoint the Member Secretary of the Council and under Section 8 (2) of the RCI Act, the Council shall, with the previous sanction of the Central Government employ such officers and other employees as deems necessary to carry out the purpose of the Act. The present staff strength of the Council is 38 (i.e., 4 in Group 'A', 11 in Group 'B' and 23 in Group 'C'). Details of sanctioned strength of staff are placed at *Annexure 8.1*.

Annual Accounts and Audit Report

The accounts of the Rehabilitation Council of India are audited under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller and Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions & Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 21(3) of RCI Regulations, 1997 notified under Section 29 of Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (34 of 1992). The Office of the Director General Audit, Central Expenditure has conducted audit of accounts for the year 2013-14 from 11.07.2014 to 22.07.2014. Annexure 8.2**Audit Report on the Accounts of the Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi for the Year 2013-14****Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of Rehabilitation Council of India for the year ended 31st March 2014**

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of Rehabilitation Council of India as at 31 March 2014, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payment Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 21 (3) of the Rehabilitation Council of India, Regulations 1997. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Council's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

2. This separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practice, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Report/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
3. We have conducted the audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
4. Based on our audit, we report that:
 - i. We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
 - ii. The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the common format approved by the Ministry of Finance.
 - iii. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Rehabilitation Council of India as required under Section 21 (2) of Rehabilitation Council of India Regulations, 1997 in so far it appears from our examination of such books.

iv. We further report that:

A. Balance Sheet

A.1 Liabilities

A.1.1 Current Liabilities & Provisions Rs.213.57 lakh (Schedule-5)

The Council has not made provision for gratuity & leave encashment and the same are being accounted for on cash basis in contravention of the Uniform Format of Accounts approved by the Government of India. Further no provision for audit fees payable has been made. Audit could not work out the actual amount of liabilities understated.

A.2. Assets

A.2.1 Investment Rs.1958.85 lakh (Schedule - 7)

The Council invested an amount of Rs.50.00 lakh in fixed deposit for one year on 01.02.2013 with maturity value of Rs.54.68 lakh. The amount was reinvested on maturity. The Council has depicted its investment as Rs.50.00 lakh instead of Rs.54.68 lakh in its books as on 31.03.2014. This has resulted into understatement of investment and interest earned by Rs.4.68 lakh each with consequent understatement of Surplus by the same amount.

A.2.2 Investment pattern

The Council had not invested General Provident Fund as per the pattern of investment prescribed by the Ministry of Finance vide notification No.F-5(88)/2006-PR dated 14.08.2008.

A.2.3 Current Assets, Loan and Advances Rs.234.89 lakh

Accrued interest amounting to Rs.2.50 lakh on investment of GPF was not accounted for. This has resulted into understatement of Current Assets and Income by the same amount.

B. Income & Expenditure account

B.1 Expenditure

B.1.1. Other Administrative Expenses Rs.340.25 lakh (Schedule-15)

Current year expenditure amounting to Rs.1.51 lakh which was paid during 2014-15 was not taken into accounts. This has resulted into understatement of expenditure and current liabilities by Rs.1.51 lakh each with consequent understatement of Surplus for the year by the same amount.

B.2 Income

B.2.1 Fees/Subscription Rs.154.76 lakh (Schedule-10)

Current year income amounting to Rs.8.77 lakh which was received in April 2014 was not taken into accounts. This has resulted in understatement of Income and Current Assets by Rs.8.77 lakh each with consequent understatement of Surplus for the year by the same amount.

B.2.2 RCI Project Rs.191.26 lakh (Schedule-16)

The interest received and interest accrued on investment of RCI Projects was Rs.22.50 lakh whereas it has been shown as Rs.20.15 lakh which has resulted in understatement of Income and Current Assets by Rs.2.35 lakh each.

C. General

The interest accrued on staff loans was not being accounted for on accrual basis.

D. Grants-in-Aid

Out of Rs.356.75 lakh (Plan Rs.211.75 lakh and Non-Plan Rs.145.00 lakh) received as grant-in-aid from Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Rs.13.00 lakh under Plan and Rs.5.00 lakh under Non-Plan was received in March 2014. It had unspent balance of previous year of Rs.54.26 lakh under Plan and Rs.96.85 lakh under DRS Networking (Plan) and also internal receipt of Rs.489.46 lakh. Out of the total funds available the Council utilized a sum of Rs.563.00 lakh.

E. Management letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Council through a management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

- v. Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the book of accounts.
- vi. 1. Contingent Liabilities - Nil. (Previous Year - Nil)
2. The Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi is a Statutory Body set up under the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (No. 34 of 1992). The Council is financed by the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Government of India through Annual Plan & Non-plan Grants-in-Aid.
3. The Council as desired based on the observations of DGACE, New Delhi in the audit report 2003-04 prepared Annual Accounts in the common/revised format approved by the Govt. of India in consultation with the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG). As per these formats, the Council has to prepare following statements:
 - a. Balance Sheet
 - b. Income & Expenditure Account
 - c. Receipts & payment Account
4. Traditionally the system of accounts being maintained in the Council are similar to the one being maintained by various government departments on accrual system of accounting, accrued interest on investment, prepaid expenses, etc., are also included in the accounts accordingly.
5. The depreciation has been provided for fixed assets since inception.
6. Physical verification of fixed assets for 2013-14 is carried out as continuous/perpetual basis every year and no deficiencies are noticed.
7. Physical verification of inventory, stationary & other consumables is carried out and no deficiencies are noticed.
8. Value of unsold publication as on 31.03.2014 is shown in the balance sheet.
9. Value of inventory/books received as gifts has been added in the schedule of assets.
10. Previous year figures have been re-grouped/re-arranged wherever necessary as per requirement of the Council.
11. Schedule of investment has been prepared in common format.
12. As separate bank accounts are maintained for RCI G.P. Fund, RCI Pension Fund, RCI Main Account, RCI Project Account and RCI NBE Account, therefore, separate receipt & payment accounts have been prepared against each account.
